

## Warwick/West Bay

- *Goddard Memorial State Park Beach, Warwick* – Located near the state park, on Ives Road, you will find plenty to do at this salt water beach on Greenwich Bay. Lifeguards are on duty during the summer season. Visitors may take advantage of the nearby nine hole golf course, an equestrian show area, bridle trails, picnic tables and game fields. Many concerts and special events are held in the Carousel building, close to the beach area.
- *Warwick City Park Beach, Warwick* – This public beach is located off Asylum Road and is a salt water beach. It has a bathhouse and kids play area. Nearby you will find bike paths, ball fields and hiking trails. Parking is available, but please take note that lifeguards are not on duty at this beach.

## Newport County

- *Easton's Beach, Newport* – Known to locals as “First Beach”, it is a ¾ mile surf beach that features more than just sand and ocean. Take a break from the sun to visit the Save the Bay Exploration Center and Aquarium or ride the 1950's carousel. A concessions stand, public restrooms and showers are available. Parking for a fee is available in one of the two beach parking lots.
- *Sachuest Beach, Middletown* – Known as “Second Beach” by locals, this beach is located just up the road from Easton's Beach. This beach is a hit with both residents of the state and tourists. The waves crash the shore of this 1.25 mile beach, with sand dunes along the back side. A concessions stand, public restrooms and showers are available. Parking for a fee is available in one of the two parking lots.
- *Third Beach, Middletown* – A beautiful, family friendly beach, faces east has less waves and overlooks Third Beach Harbor located near the mouth of the Sakonnet River. There are grills, picnic tables and a shade structures located near the boat ramp. Port-a-johns are located in the parking lots. Equipment rentals and a Del's Lemonade cart can be found near the boat ramp (on the south end). Third Beach is a stretch of beach that is separated into four different beaches. These include Third Beach Boat Ramp, East Middletown Town Beach and two semi-private beaches, Peabody and Third Beach Club. Parking is available at Third Beach Ramp for a fee, East Middletown Town Beach is only available to town residents with a parking sticker, Peabody is semi-private with parking for a fee and Third Beach Club is for it's members only.
- *Sandy Point Beach, Portsmouth* – Located at the end of Sandy Point Avenue, this beach is shallow and natural, which makes it great for families. Changing rooms, restroom facilities and picnic tables are available and lifeguards are on duty during the summer season. Ample parking is available and there is a fee to nonresidents of Portsmouth.
- *South Shore Beach, Little Compton* – Located off South Shore Road, South Shore Beach is a small, rocky beach that has a wonderful view of the ocean. While it does not have a concession stand, there are lifeguards on duty during the summer season and port-o-johns are available. Parking is available for a small fee to non-residents of Little Compton.
- *Fogland Beach, Tiverton* – Located off of Fogland Road/Three Rod Way, this beach provides a great windsurfing area and beautiful views of the Sakonnet River. Life guards are on duty during the summer season. Please note that there are no trash receptacles located on the beach.

## East Bay

- *Barrington Town Beach, Barrington* – This beach is home to four acres of beachfront overlooking Narragansett Bay. Located just off Bay Road, you'll find a number of concerts taking place over the summer at this beach. Lifeguards are on duty from June to September and a vendor is available to purchase food and drinks.
- *Bristol Town Beach, Bristol* – Located off Asylum Road, this sandy, gravelly beach fronts the upper part of Narragansett Bay. Behind the beach is a grassy area, picnic tables, a playground and tennis, softball and basketball facilities. A lifeguard is on duty during the summer season and ample parking is available for a fee. Concessions, toilets and trash receptacles are also available at this town beach.
- *Warren Town Beach, Warren* – Adjacent to Burr's Hill Park, the beach is located just off Water Street. It is a perfect spot for a beach day with the family. It has shallow water and a playground, which is popular among families with small children. Parking is available and lifeguards will be on duty during the summer season.

## South County

- *Charlestown Town Beach, Charlestown* – Located off Charlestown Beach Road, this stretch of fine sand and water is a perfect summer sight. Lifeguards are on duty daily during the summer season. Please note, this beach only accepts cash. Parking is available for a fee.
- *Narragansett Town Beach, Narragansett* – Located in the center of town, this classic New England saltwater beach front offers approximately 19 acres of beach. Concessions, restrooms and a surfing area are all offered here. Ample parking is available in four separate lots for a fee.
- *Scarborough State Beach, Narragansett* – One of Rhode Island's most popular and well known beaches. This state beach is located just off Ocean Road. This 26 acre facility features 2 pavilions, showers, picnic tables and an observation tower with scenic views. Lifeguards are on duty daily during the summer season and parking is available for a fee.
- *Misquamicut State Beach, Westerly* – This state beach, located off Atlantic Avenue, has over a half mile of beach front for guests to enjoy. Concessions, a bathhouse and outside showers are available at this beach. Lifeguards will be on duty during the summer season and parking is available for a fee. Please note this beach is known to fill to capacity during sunny summer weekends.
